Designated Local Governments

- Only those municipalities in the Jordan and Randleman Watersheds are designated
- Local governments do <u>not</u> review State, Local or Federal government projects

Delegated Local Governments

- A local government can request delegation of the Rule if they choose.
- Orange County is delegated the Neuse Buffer Rule
- Pitt County is delegated the Neuse and Tar-Pamlico Buffer Rule
- Morrisville is delegated the Neuse Buffer Rule



Activities of a Designated/Delegated Local Government

- Must make stream/buffer calls. Appeal are sent to the Director of DWQ
- Issue Buffer Authorizations
- Issue Minor Variances
- Compile a Findings of Fact of Major Variances to be sent to DWQ
- Compliance/Enforcement
- Review diffuse flow
